



| **Reformed, Relational, Real**

There are at least 3 things that the BTC conference seeks to be:

I. REFORMED

- We are unapologetic about the truths that we profess and the doctrines that we hold to.
- We find unity with other believers through a common stance on doctrines.
- We seek to promote Reformed theology in the lives of young people so that the truths that our parents' generation of Reformed Baptists fought so hard to teach and preserve will not be forgotten in our lifetimes.
- Our generation, just like every generation before us, has a responsibility to promote Gospel truth in a fallen world. This, then, is one of the goals of the BTC conferences.

II. RELATIONAL

- One of the beautiful aspects of the church, the body of Christ, is that it is comprised of many diverse parts.
- Through the BTC conferences we have sought to promote solid Christian fellowship within the body of Christ, both at Grace Covenant Church and throughout our Association nationwide.
- We have heard from many young people—either directly or indirectly—who have shared their appreciation for the fellowship they have enjoyed at the past BTC conferences.
- Real, potentially life-long friendships have been born at BTC. We thank the Lord for what He has done in using this conference to bring young believers together. These young believers are the future of our churches, and many of them now may know more Reformed Baptists across the country than their own parents!
- This then is another reason anyone between the ages of 18 and 30-ish, single *AND* married, is encouraged to join us for the BTC conference each summer.

III. REAL

- Finally, BTC is not a conference where attendees are promised that their lives will be changed through some mountain-top experience of a weekend.
- The Bible is real, Christianity is real, Reformed Baptist theology is real. Therefore BTC also seeks to be real in the way we approach the various topics at each conference.
- We don't want to sugar-coat reality—not the reality of the Gospel nor the reality of the Christian life. Christ wasn't using sugar-coating when He told His disciples in Matthew 10:39, *"Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it."*
- So at BTC we want to present a real, authentic view of Christian life and the church and not some exaggerated Disney-esque fable of how things are.
